with the appearance of a textbook as comprehensive as this one it is clear that the field of geriatrics is coming of age the broad scope of these volumes shapes a substantial answer to the question what is geriatrics and why should we be interested in it as i see it there are at least five reasons first the scientific or intellectual reason gerontology is the study of aging from the biologic psychological and social perspectives there is increasing interest in the fascinating insights into the biologic mechanisms of aging errors in protein synthesis dna repair mechanisms alterations of the neuroendocrine system changes in the immune system genetic controls and somatic mutations second the demographic reason this is the century of old age there has been a 26 year gain in the average life expectancy this gain compares with that acquired from 3 000 years b c the bronze age to the year 1900 which was about 29 years therefore in one century there has been a gain in the average life expectancy almost equal to 5 000 previous years of human history in 1830 one of three newborn infants survived beyond 60 years of age

prior to the evolution of modern medicine with its superabundance of diagnostic and therapeutic medical technology and the rise of the litigious society the value of clinical skills was evident in both history taking and the physical examination even today physicians can make a correct diagnosis solely by utilizing their clinical skills in about 90 of patient encounters furthermore in the past physicians understood their role as a psychologist and were more apt to be familiar with the social context of their patients house calls were common the doctor was also a placebo who at his best inspired hope and probably sped recovery geriatricians use both clinical skills and take advantage of modern technology sparingly for they know they are dealing with the most challenging and frail of patients older patients who so often present with multiple complex interacting behavioral social and physical problems in contrast to medicine for young people working with the older patient is much more demanding furthermore the complex issue of societal attitudes toward old people can come into play specifically the physician's need to deal with natural fears of aging dependency depression dementia and death ageism is the enemy of effective medical treatment at its best geriatrics exemplifies ways that medical care for all ages can become more humane problem oriented and holistic

both volumes sold as a combined set for a one time purchase older adults represent the most rapidly growing demographic in the us and in many developed countries around the world the field of geriatric medicine is still relatively young and is only recently seeing a significant increase in peer reviewed literature medicare and medicaid expenditures related to older adults are nearly a trillion dollars year in the us how our healthcare system cares for older adults and how those older adults navigate an increasingly complex system is of the utmost importance according to the institute of medicine physicians and other healthcare professionals receive an inadequate amount of training in geriatric medicine geriatric medicine is based on the concept of delivering person centered care with a focus on function and quality of life it is essential that physicians nurse practitioners physician assistants pharmacists social workers and other health care professionals all be knowledgeable about the geriatric approach to care geriatric medicine varies from most other

fields in medicine while many specialties function on the basis of evidence based literature geriatricians and other clinicians caring for older adults must integrate relatively limited evidence with variable physiological changes and complex psychosocial determinants geriatricians are used to caring for 90 year olds with multiple chronic illnesses their variable physiology leads to uncertain responses to pharmacotherapy and their personal goals and wishes need to be incorporated into any plan of care practicing geriatric medicine requires the ability to see patterns but it goes one step further as the rules are constantly in flux every patient is an individual with particular needs and goals in order to provide true person centered care to older adults one has to incorporate these factors into the decision making process the proposed handbook is designed to present a comprehensive and state of the art update that incorporates existing literature with clinical experience basic science and the physiology of aging create a background but are not the main focus this is because every chapter has been written through the lens of person centered care this book is about focusing on what matters to the person and how that is not always about pathology and physiology the reader generally will not find simple solutions to symptoms diseases and syndromes in fact the key to caring for geriatric patients is the ability to think both critically and divergently at the same time geriatrics encompasses multiple disciplines and spans all of the subspecialties it requires knowledge of working within an interdisciplinary team it requires an appreciation of how quality of life varies with each individual and creates treatment and care plans that also vary and most of all it requires a firm commitment to first learning who the person is so that all of the necessary data can be analyzed and integrated into a true person centered plan of care this book aims to serve as an unparalleled resource for meeting these challenges updated and revised from the previous edition this text features over 40 new peer reviewed chapters new references and a wide array of useful new tools that are updated on a regular basis by interdisciplinary and interprofessional experts in geriatric medicine

as the baby boomers age concerns over healthcare systems abilities to accommodate geriatric patients grow increasingly challenging this is especially true with the population deemed to be the oldest of the old specifically those over the age of 85 unlike any other time in history this demographic is the fastest growing segment of most developed countries in the united states the oldest old is projected to double from 4.3 million to 9.6 million by 2030 the increased life expectancy of the population since the early 1900s has been built on the improvement of living conditions diet public health and advancement in medical care with this we have seen a steady decline in the age specific prevalence of vascular and heart diseases stroke and even dementia older persons are healthier today than their counterparts decades ago more importantly than in any other age group the care of the oldest old must be individualized management decisions should be made taking into consideration the older persons expressed wishes quality of life function and mental capacity

the inevitable consequence is that there will be an increase in the prevalence of older persons with chronic diseases multiple co existing pathologies and neuro degenerative diseases the oldest of the aging population are often excluded from drug trials and their treatments are largely based on findings extrapolated from that of the younger old furthermore among the oldest old physiologically they are more diverse than other segments of the population their demographic characteristics are unparalleled and different compared to that of the younger old several studies have drawn attention to the differing attitudes among health professionals towards elderly people and many show prejudice because they are old as a result the use of age as a criteria in determining the appropriateness of treatment is of very limited validity yet there are limited resources that guide physicians through these challenges this book creates a greater awareness of these challenges and offers practical guidelines for working within the infrastructures vital to this demographic this book is designed for geriatricians primary care physicians junior medical officers specialty geriatrics nurses and gerontologists it is divided into 3 sections chronic diseases and geriatric syndromes each chapter provides a summary of important and essential information under the heading of key points case studies are included in some of the chapters to highlight the principles of management

the proportion of the population of octogenarians and elderly patients presenting for intensive care is rapidly increasing thus exacerbating the need to modify our critical care management to cater for this patient group this book will provide practical guidance on all issues related to the critical care of elderly patients incorporating physiological and epidemiological information clinical guidance ethical and end of life issues and advice about optimal use of drugs and new technologies complications of polypharmacy high risk surgery and increased recovery times are also discussed chapters are concise each including a list of key points and summary of available data making this a quick reference for experienced consultants as well as a useful resource for trainees preparing for exams
